
- (b) That the Government may, at its option cure any monetary default by paying the amount of the Mortgagor's delinquent payments to the Mortgagee, or pay the obligation in full and the Mortgagee will assign the lien to the Government subject to any provisions for borrower rights incorporated therein or otherwise applicable to the Mortgagor as stated in
