convey unto John A. Pitger of the County and State aforesaid his heirs & assigns the following described real Estate to wit:
 The East half of the South East quarter of Section Twenty five (25) Township No. twenty six North Range Twenty Eight (28) & the Southeast quarter of Section No. Thirty (30) & Twenty four acres off of the North End of the North East quarter of South west quarter of Section No. nineteen (19) in Township No. Twenty six North Range No. Twenty seven & East 3rd T.M. and against the title against all persons whomsoever. The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the said Charles Croner has this day executed to the said Pitger his promissory note bearing even date herewith for the sum of Five hundred and sixty five dollars payable on or before the 15th day of next Nov. If said Croner his heirs or assigns shall pay or cause to be paid to said Pitger his heirs or assigns said sum of money at the time above stated then the above conveyance to be void otherwise in full. 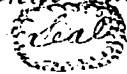
