To all to whom these presents shall come greeting. Know

Ye that in pursuance of an act of Congress entitled an act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes approved February 11th 1847 William A Wood Elizabeth A Parks (Wife of Robert A Parks) Regiments Wood Handy Wood Silbert Wood and Mary C Wood only brothers and sisters heirs at law of Robert A Wood deceased late a private in Captain David Company fourth Regiment Tennessee Volunteers having deposited in the general Land Office a warrant in their favor numbered 40891 There is therefore granted by the united States unto Ebenzer Elliott assignee of said William A Wood Elizabeth A Parks Regiments Wood Handy Wood Silbert Wood & Mary C Wood and to his heirs, the West half of the South West quarter of Section twenty three, and the East half of the East quarter of Section twenty two, in Township seventy six South of Range twenty eight, West in the District of lands subject to sale at Lima City Ohio, containing One thousand and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the general Land Office by the surveyor general which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned warrant in pursuance of the act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th 1847 To have and to hold the said parts said sections of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Ebenzer Elliott and to his heirs and assigns forever In testimony whereof I Millard Fillmore President of the united States of America, have caused these Letters to be made patent and the seal of the general Land Office to be hereunto affixed: Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the first day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred

and fifty-one and of the Independence of the United States the sixty-sixth
