To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.
Know ye that in pursuance of act of Congress entitled
that an act to raise for a limited time an additional
military force and for other purposes approved
February 11th 1847 William P. Stewart Private and promoted to Lieutenant
in Captain White's company First Regiment Ohio Volunteers, having
deposited in the general Land office a warrant in his favor numbered
68888 There is therefore granted by the United States unto Ebenzer
Elliott assignee of said William P. Stewart and to his heirs, the
North fractional half of the North East quarter of section two in
Township seventy five of twenty in the District of Lands subject to
sale at Fairfield Ohio containing one hundred and sixty three
acres and ninety six hundredths of an acre according to the official
Map of the survey of the Land returned to the general Land office by
the surveyor general which said tract have been located in satisfaction
of the above mentioned Warrant in pursuance of the act of Congress
mentioned approved February 11th 1847 Except said tract for as per return
numbered 19310 To have and to hold the said parts of said section
of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Ebenzer Elliott and
to his heirs and assigns forever In testimony whereof Millard Fillmore
President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be
made Patent and the seal of the general Land office to be hereunto affixed

fifty and of the Independence of the United States the seventy-first
