To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting,
Know ye That in pursuance of act of Congress entit-
led an act to raise for a limited time an addition-
al military force and for other purposes approved
February 11th 1861, William P. Stewart, Private and promoted to Lieutenant
in Captain White's Company First Regiment Ohio Volunteers, having
duties in the general Land office a warrant in his favor numbered
68,888 there is therefore granted by the United States unto Ebenezer
Elliott aforesaid of said William P. Stewart and to his heirs, the
North東itional half of the North East quarter of section two in
Township Seventy five of twenty in the District of Lands subject to
Sale at Fairfield Town containing one hundred and sixty three
acres, and thirty six hundredths of an acre according to the official
Plan of the Survey of the Land returned to the general Land office by
the Surveyor General which said tract have been located in satisfaction
of the above mentioned Warrant in pursuance of the act of Congress
mentioned aforesaid February 11th 1861 Except laid for expenses received
said number 19,310 to have and to hold the said parts of said section
of land with the appurtenances therof unto the said Ebenezer Elliott and
to his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof Millard Fillmore
President of the United States of America has caused these letters to be
made Public and the seal of the general Land office to be hereunto affixed

September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
fifty and of the Independence of the United States the seventy fifth
By the President, Millard Fillmore.
