to whom these presents shall come greeting,
Know ye that in pursuance of an act of Congress
entitled an act to raise upon a limited time

an additional military force and for other purposes approved February
11th 1847 James P. Rino private in Captain Roberts Company first
Regiment Indiana Volunteers having deposited in the General Land
office a warrant in his favor numbered 71808 there is therefore gra-
nted by the United States unto the said James P. Rino and to his
heirs the South half of the South East quarter of Section twenty
nine and the South West quarter of the South West quarter of
Section twenty eight and the North West quarter of the North
West quarter of Section thirty three in Township Seventy five
North of Range twenty six West in the District of Iowa
subject to sale at Fairfield Iowa containing one hundred
and sixty acres according to the official plat of survey of
the said land returned to the General Land office by the Survey-
general which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the
above mentioned warrant in pursuance of the act of Congress above
mentioned approved February 11th 1847 to have and to hold
the said parts of said Sections of land with the appurtenances
thereof unto the said James P. Rino and to his heirs and assigns
forever in testimony whereof J. Willard Fullmore President
of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made
patent and the Seal of the General Land office to be hereunto
affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the
Eight day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and fifty two and of the Independence of
the United States the Twenty by the President
