 assigns & assigns forever, & eight (8) in Block No. thirteen (13), in the town of Loring,  
 to wit the West of Justice for said Co. To have and to hold the  
 same with the appurtenances unto the said Loring Fisher, his heirs  
 & assigns forever. And the said Comrs. for themselves & their successors  
 in office doth hereby covenant unto said Loring Fisher & his heirs  
 that they are lawfully seized of the premises of record that the  
 premises are free and clear from all incumbrances whatsoever &  
 that they will forever warrant & defend the same against the  
 lawful claims of all persons whomsoever in respect of which  
 we the said Comrs. have hereunto set our hands & corporate  
 seals this 9th day of July A.D. 1857
