 Madison County State of Iowa in consideration
 of the sum of three hundred & twenty Dollars in hand paid, do
 hereby sell and convey unto James M. Watson of Calhoun County and
 State of Iowa the following described premises to wit: The East
 half of the North West q. of Section No. Twenty One (21) & the east half
 of the South West q. of the North East q. of Section No. Twenty Three (23)
 All in Township No. twenty first (21) Range No. Twenty Second (22) Madison
 County Iowa. And we do hereby Covenant with the said James
 M. Watson we are lawfully seized of said premises, that they are free
 from incumbrances, that we have good right and lawful authority to sell
 the same, and we do hereby Covenant to Warrant and Defend the
 said premises against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever.
