

William Davis This Indenture made this 28th day of January
 1852 between Thomas Howell in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and fifty six between William Davis
 and Susan Davis his wife of McDonough County
 and state of Illinois of the first part and Thomas Howell
 of Hutton County and state aforesaid of the second part
 Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part for and
 in consideration of the sum of nine hundred dollars
 paid by the said party of the second part the receipt
 of which is hereby acknowledged has granted bargained sold
 conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant
 bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said party of
 the second part his heirs and assigns a certain tract
 or parcel of land situated in Madison County and state
 aforesaid and described as follows to wit The South East
 quarter of section thirty two (32) in Township Seventy
 six (76) North of Range twenty eight (28) West and
 the South half of North East quarter of section thirty
 two (32) Township Seventy six (76) North of Range
 twenty eight (28) West together with all and singular
 the tenements rights and privileges
 and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise
 appertaining to have and to hold the said premises as
 above described with the appurtenances to the said
 party of the second part his heirs and assigns for
 ever and the said parties of the first part for their
 selves and their heirs Executors and Administrators
 do hereby covenant to and with the said party of the
 second part his heirs Executors Administrators
 and assigns that they are well seized of the premises
 above conveyed as of a good and indefeasible estate
 in fee simple and his a good right to sell and
 convey the same in manner and form as aforesaid
 that they are free from all incumbrances and that
 the above bargained premises in the quiet and peaceful
 possession of the said party of the second part his heirs
 or assigns against the claims of all persons whomsoever
 with warrant and forever defend.
