Thomas J Moon

Benjamin Johnson acknowledges myself indebted to Thomas J Moon in the sum of Eight hundred Dollars to be void upon the following conditions to wit: Whereas I have

this day sold unto the said Thomas J Moon the following real estates to wit: the west half of South East quarter 1st of section No. Twenty Eight (28) in Township No. Seventy four (74) North of Range No. Twenty eight (28) West containing eighty acres more or less for the sum of four hundred dollars for which the said Thomas J Moon has this day paid two hundred Dollars down and executed two promissory notes bearing even date herewith one for fifty Dollars to be paid in cash if said moon chooses so to do if not in Money due two years after date bearing six percent interest from date the other for one hundred and fifty Dollars payable in two years from date bearing six per cent interest from date with the privilege of paying him Sixteen Dollars in lumber at two Dollars per hundred if he chooses the lumber to be Oak or Walnut Barn Siding &c. if the said Benjamin Johnson Maple or Lumber to be made out and delivered to the said Thomas J Moon a good and sufficient Deed for said premises upon the payment in full of said notes when they become due then this obligation to be void otherwise to be and remain in full force in virtue in law Signed this the seventeenth day of August AD 1855
