To D. Deed Ann Manning his wife of Polk County State of Iowa in Consideration
of the sum of two thousand Dollars in hand paid us by
Moseley Brookhead of the following described premises to wit the west fractional half of the East Quarter
of the Northeast fractional Quarter of the Northeast fractional Quarter and the west half
of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of section twelve (12) and the East half of the
North West Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of section twelve (12) and five acres off of
the east side of the South half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter and the North
half of the North West Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of section eleven (11) except three
acres out of the Northwest corner being twenty rods east by twenty four rods south all in town
ship No 76 Security six North of Range 33 twenty six, 26, West of the fifth Pm and being in
Monroe County Iowa and containing one hundred and Ninety Eight and $\frac{3}{4}$ acres according
to the government survey and we do hereby Covenant with the said Moseley Brookhead
that we are lawfully seized of said premises that they are free from incumbrance
so that we have good right and lawful authority to sell the same and we do hereby
Covenant to warrant and defend the said premises against the lawful claims
of all persons whomsoever and the said Ann Manning hereby relinquishes all
her right of action in and to the above described premises signed this twelfth
Day of March A.D 1838
