 Horatio Martin To O Deed A B C Davis I know all men by these presents that I Horatio Martin Administrator of the estate of John Walsh late of Madison County Iowa for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty Dollars in hand paid in accordance with an order of the County Court of Madison County Iowa in pursuance of the same in such case made and provided do hereby sell and convey unto A B C Davis of Warren County Iowa a tract of land situate his being the highest price offered the following described real estate belonging to the estate of the said John Walsh deceased to wit the South two thirds of the East fractional half of the North west quarter of section No twenty five (25) in Township No seventy seven (77) North of range No twenty six (26) West containing fifty two and two thirds acre better same more or less and I do hereby warrant the title of the same to the said A B C Davis his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims of all persons whomever in witness whereof I have set my hand this 19th day of October AD 1858 Horatio Martin Administrator
