come greeting Whereas Stephen Kelly of Madison County Iowa has
(Certificated) deposited in the general Land Office of the United States a certificate
(No 12765) of the register of the same Office at Charleston whereby it appears
that full payment has been made by the said Stephen Kelly according
to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act
making further provisions for the sale of the public lands for the North East
quarter of the South East quarter of Section twelve in Township seventy
five North of Range twenty six in the district of Lands subject to sale at
Charleston Iowa containing forty acres according to the Official Plat of the
Survey of the said Lands returned to the general Land Office by the Surveyor
General which said tract has been purchased by the said Stephen
Kelly Now Know ye that the United States of America in consideration
of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress
in such cases made and provided have given and granted and by
these presents do give and grant unto the said Stephen Kelly
and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to
hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and
appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the
said Stephen Kelly and to his heirs and assigns forever In testimony
Whereof I Franklin Pierce President of the United States of Amer-
ica have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of
the general Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under
my hand at the City of Washington the tenth day of June
in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and
fifty six and of the independence of the United States Eightieth
