Whereas A. Holiday of Madison County Iowa has deposited in the Office of the State of Iowa a certificate of the Schoolfund Commission of Madison County Iowa whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said A. Holiday according to the provisions of the act of the general assembly of the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 1867 Entitled an act to provide for the management and disposition of the Schoolfund for the South East quarter of Section Twenty six (26) Township Seventy six (76) North Range twenty eight (28) West of 5<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian containing One Hundred Sixty (60) acres according to the official plot of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office of the United States by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said A. Holiday Now know that the State of Iowa in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of the general assembly in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said A. Holiday and to her heirs and assigns the said tract of land above described to have and to hold the the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto

the said A. Holley and to her heirs and assigns forever in testimony whereof  
 I James M. Grimes Governor of the State of Iowa have caused these letters to be  
 made Patent, and the great Seal of the State of Iowa to be hereunto affixed  
 Given under my hand at Des Moines City the tenth (10) day of December in  
 the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven and of  
 the State of Iowa the twelfth  
 by the Governor James Grimes
