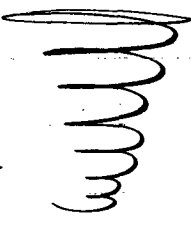

The foregoing sale is subject to the following
conditions to wit. Whereas said William Jones has this
day executed his promissory note to said W. W. McKnight
for the sum of Two hundred and fifty five dollars and
fifty five cents. with ten per cent interest payable at
Winterest. Six months after date. Now if said W. W.
Jones shall well & truly pay said note at its maturity
then these presents to be null and void. Otherwise to be
in full force & effect at law April 6th 1860
