Wilson for himself and heirs with hereby covenant with said
Alexander Wilson his heirs and assigns that he is lawfully
seized of the premises aforesaid that the premises are free and
clear from all incumbrance whatever and that he will forever
warrant and defend the same with the appurtenances unto the
Said Alexander Wilson his heirs and assigns against the
lawful claims of all persons whatsoever In testimony
whereof the said Henry W. Wilson has hereunto set his hand
