Know all men by these presents that we Arnold Wheeler and Catharine Wheeler wife of said Arnold Wheeler of the County of Licking in the State of Ohio In consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars in hand paid by John Miller of the County of Licking and State of Ohio has bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain sell and convey unto the said John Miller his heirs and assigns forever the following described premises situate in the County of Madison and State of Ohio and bounded and described as follows Lying in the South East quarter of Section Number Ten in Township Number Seventy four 74 West of Range Number Twenty Six 26 with containing One hundred and Sixty acres 160 Also the following described premises lying in the County and State aforesaid Eleven acres to come of the North side of the North East quadrant quarter of Section Two in Township Number Seventy ^{and} ~~four~~ 74th of Range Number Twenty Six 26 West to have and to hold said premises with the appurtenances unto the said John Miller his heirs and assigns forever and the said Arnold Wheeler and Catharine Wheeler for themselves heirs executors and administrators hereby covenants with said John Miller his heirs and assigns that they are lawfully seized of the premises aforesaid and that the said premises are free and clear of all incumbrances whatsoever and that they will forever warrant and defend the same with the appurtenances unto the said John Miller his heirs and assigns against all lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever In Testimony Whereof the said Arnold Wheeler and Catharine Wheeler his wife who hereby relinquishes
