D. Petterson the following described tract of land or premises  
to wit The South west quarter and East half of North west  
quarter and thirty acres off of South end of the west half  
of the North west quarter and six acres off of the west end  
of the South half of the North East quarter and the North  
west quarter of the North East quarter of Section Twenty Seven  
lands the west half of the East and the East half of the west  
half of Section Twenty Two lands the South west quarter of  
Section fifteen all being and lying in Township 47 Seventy  
Seven North of Range 28 Twenty Six West containing six hundred  
and ninety six acres according to the United State Survey and  
lying and being in Madison County State of Iowa and we  
do hereby covenant with the said John D. Petterson that we  
are lawfully seized of said premises that they are free  
from all incumbrance that we have good right and lawful  
authority to sell and convey the same and we do hereby  
covenant to warrant and defend the said premises  
against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever  
except such claims as may arise from sales for Taxes
