and to be known and used as a common burying-ground lying and being in the county of Madison county and State of Iowa and bounded and described as follows. Commencing at the South East corner of the North East fourth of the South East fourth of Section No Twenty Six (26) Township Seventy Seven (77) Range (27) Twenty Seven thence west to 9°.30' Forty six rods thence north two rods for a road to a stone at corner No 1 thence North Fourteen rods to a stone at corner No 2 thence west Fourteen rods to a stone at corner No 3 thence South Fourteen rods to a stone at corner No 4 to 9°.30' on all the lines The said premises forever to be used and kept for a common burying ground In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 15th day of April AD 1863.
