Know all men by these presents that we James M. Lee and Elmer Lee wife of said James M. Lee of the County of Madison State of Iowa in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars in hand paid by James Martin of the same place, have bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain sell and convey unto the said James Martin his heirs and assigns forever, the following premises situated in the County of Madison and State of Iowa and bounded and described as follows. viz., East half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the Northwest Quarter $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section Eleven (11) Township Seventy-five (75) North of Range Twenty Six West. To have and to hold said premises with the appurtenances unto the said James Martin his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James M. Lee for himself and heirs doth hereby covenant with said James Martin his heirs and that he is lawfully seised of the premises aforesaid, that the premises are free and clear from all incumbrances whatever, and that he will forever warrant and defend the same with the appurtenance unto the said James Martin his heirs and assigns against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. In testimony whereof the said James M. Lee and Elmer Lee his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals this first day of May in the Year one thousand eight hundred and fifty four.
