The United States of America To all whom
these presents shall Come Greeting.

Whereas In pursuance of the Act of Congress
Approved March 3, 1855 entitled "An Act in addition to certain acts granting
Bounty land to Certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the
Military service of the United States, there has been deposited in the
General Land Office Warrant No 32356 for 120 Acres in favor of Benjamin
Ingalls Corporal in Captain Read's Company Massachusetts Militia War 1812
with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the
South West quarter of section twelve and the South east quarter of the South east
quarter of section eleven in Township seventy four North of range twenty eight
West in the district of lands subject to sale at Chautau Iowa, Containing
One hundred and twenty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the
Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
General the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Benjamin
Ingalls to Joseph Monte in whose favor said tract has been located.

Now Know ye that there is granted by the United States unto the Joseph
Monte as assigned as aforesaid and to his heirs, the tract of land
above described to have and to hold the said tract of land unto the
Appointances thereof unto the said Joseph Monte as assigned as
aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I James Buchanan, President of the
United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent and the
seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my
hand at the City of Washington the first day of July in the year of
Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine and of the Indepen-
dence of the United States the Eighty third
