Iowa do hereby **Sell and Convey**, unto the said Bolser Heartsook

the following described premises, situate in the County of Madison, and State of Iowa, to-wit:

corner of Section Thirty two (32), thence West One hundred and
twenty Rods, thence North Twenty six & two thirds Rods, thence
East One hundred and twenty Rods, thence South Twenty six
and two thirds Rods, to the place of beginning, containing

5th P. M. Iowa.
