the following described premises, situate in the County of Madison, and State of Iowa, to-wit: Ten (10) acres off of the East side of the North West quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section number Thirty five (35) in Township number Seventy four (74) North; of Range No Twenty Eight (28) West, 5th P.
