Whereas Horace Wilkins, of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Chariton, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Horace Wilkins according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the public lands", for the South West quarter of the North East quarter of Section fifteen, in Township Seventy-five, North, of Range Twenty-nine, West, in the District of land subject to sale at Chariton Iowa, containing Forty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Horace Wilkins.

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, We have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Horace Wilkins, and to his heirs, the said Tract above described, to have and hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Horace Wilkins, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
