To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:
wheras, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved
March 3, 1855, entitled, "An Act in addition to
certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain

Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of
the United States", there has been deposited in the General Land Office,
warrant No. 14,277, for 160 acres, in favor of John Prentice Seaman
U. S. Ship Cumberland, United States Navy, War with Mexico, with
evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East half of the North
West quarter, and the West half of the North East quarter of Section
Twenty nine, in Township Seventy-four, of Range Twenty nine, in the
District of Lands subject to sale at Chariton, Iowa, containing One
Hundred and Sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey
of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
General, the said warrant having been assigned by the said John
Prentice, to Russel Gilbert, in whose favor the said tract has been
located, Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United
States unto the said Russel Gilbert as assignee as aforesaid and to
his heirs, the tract of land above described: to have and to hold the said
tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Russel Gilbert
as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.

of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent
and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed,
