hand paid by William Shelburn, do hereby sell and convey unto the said William Shelburn, the following described premises, situated in the County of Madison and State of Iowa, to-wit: the North West quarter of North West quarter of Section No. Twenty-nine (29), Township No. Seventy-four (74) Range No. Twenty-seven (27) West, also, the South East quarter of the North East quarter and the North East quarter of the South East, of Section No. Thirty (30), Township No. Seventy-four (74) Range No. Twenty-seven (27) West, containing One Hundred and Twenty (120) acres, also, Fifteen acres being a part of the North West quarter of the South East quarter, of Section No. Twenty-one (21) Township No. Seventy-four, North of Range Twenty-seven (27) West, bounded as follows beginning at the center of said Section No. Twenty-one (21), thence East, Thirty rods, thence South Eighty rods, thence West Thirty rods, thence North Eighty rods to the place of beginning, also, the West half of the South East fourth, of the North West fourth, of Section Thirty (30), Township Seventy-four (74), Range Twenty-eight (28) West, containing Twenty acres, more or less, And they hereby covenant with the said William Shelburn, that they hold the said premises by good and perfect title, that they have good right and lawful authority to sell and convey the same, that they are free and clear of all liens and incumbrances whatsoever, and they covenant to warrant and defend the said premises against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever and the said Sarah Long hereby relinquishes her right of dower in and to the above described premises.
