Know all Men by these Presents, That we Stephen Abrahams and Sarah Abrahams his wife of Madison County and State of Iowa in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars, in hand paid, by William Whitworth of Bureau County, and State of Illinois do hereby **Sell and Convey**, unto the said William Whitworth

the following described premises, situate in the County of Madison, and State of Iowa, to-wit:

The North West fourth (1/4) of the North East fourth (1/4) of Section Fifteen (15) in Township Seventy four (74) North, Range Twenty nine (29) West. of 5th P. M. Iowa. Containing forty Acres more or less.

And we hereby covenant with the said William Whitworth that we hold said premises by good and perfect title, that we have good, right, and lawful authority, to sell and convey the same: that they are free, and clear of all liens and incumbrances whatsoever. And we covenant to warrant and defend the said premises against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever; and the said Sarah Abrahams hereby relinquishes her right of dower in and to the above described premises.
