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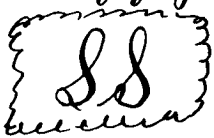
Francis A. Cunningham

The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting;

Know ye, that in pursuance of an Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional Military force, and for other purposes" approved February 11th 1847 William Mortimer, Sergeant in Captain Braggs Company, Third Regiment United States Artillery, having deposited in the General Land Office a Warrant in his favor, numbered 71.170. There is therefore granted by the United States unto Francis A. Cunningham, assignee of said William Mortimer, and to his heirs, the North East quarter of Section Thirty four, in Township Seventy six North, of Range Twenty eight West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Iowa City, Iowa, containing One hundred and Sixty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th 1847. To have and to hold the said part of said Section of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Francis A. Cunningham, and to his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof I, Millard Fillmore President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the tenth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty two, and of the Independence of the United States the Seventy Seventh.
