of Range Twenty Eight (28) West. Also the Undivided half of the East
half (½) of the South West quarter (¼) of Section Ten (10) Township Seventy five
(75) North; of Range Twenty Eight (28) West. In witness whereof the said

and seals this the sixth Day of February, Eighteen hundred and sixty five 1865.


