Avery and Alfred Avery parties of the first part, and Harriet Delap party of the second part all of Sauk County Wisconsin, Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, have given, granted, bargained, sold, remised, released, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents, do give, grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, alien, convey and confirm, unto the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns forever, the following pieces of land, situate in the County of Madison and State of Iowa, and known and described as follows, The North East quarter of the North West quarter, and the North West quarter of the North East quarter of Section Twenty two "22" in Township Seventy four "74" North of Range Twenty eight "28", and Twenty five "25" acres of Timber off the South end of the South West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Ten "10" in Township Seventy four "74" of Range Twenty eight 28 West. - And also Lots three "3" and Four "4" in Block Six "6"

of Jenkins Addition to the City of Winterset, Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim or demand whatsoever of the said parties of the first part, either in law or equity, either in possession or expectancy of, in and to the above bargained premises, and their hereditaments and appurtenances. And the said grantors for themselves their heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant, grant, bargain and agree to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents they are well seized of the premises above described, as of a good, sure, perfect, absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance in the Law, in fee simple, and that the same are free and clear from all incumbrances whatsoever, and that the above bargained premises, in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns, against all and every person or persons, lawfully claiming the whole or any part thereof they will forever warrant and defend.
