Whereas, Dominick Gilleran of Madison County, Iowa has deposited in the general Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Des Moines whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Dominick Gilleran according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24 of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of the public lands" for the North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section nine in Township Seventy Six North of Range Twenty nine West in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa containing forty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the general Land Office by the Surveyors General which said tract has been purchased by the said Dominick Gilleran Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Dominick Gilleran and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Dominick Gilleran and to his heirs and assigns forever In testimony whereof I Franklin Pierce President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the city of Washington the first day of October in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five and of the Independence of the United States the Eightieth
