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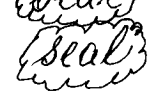

belonging unto the said Mazy A. Dicken her heirs and assigns forever.
And the said John Miller and Ruth Miller his wife, for themselves,
their heirs, executors and administrators, hereby covenants with
the said Mazy A. Dicken her heirs and assigns, that they are lawfully
seized of the premises aforesaid, and that said premises are free and
clear of all incumbrances whatsoever. And that they will forever
warrant and defend the same with the appurtenances unto the said
Mazy A. Dicken her heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims
and demands of all persons whomsoever. In testimony whereof,

relinquishes her right of dower in the premises above described)
