Know all Men by these presents,
 That we Mazy A. Miller and Clark
 Miller husband of said Mazy Miller, of the County of Gusca-
 rawas, in the State of Ohio, in consideration of the sum of Four
 hundred dollars in hand paid by Gacy Dicken of the County
 of Guscarawas, and State of Ohio, has bargained and sold, and
 do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Gacy
 Dicken her heirs and assigns forever, the following described
 premises, situate in the County of Madison and State of Iowa,
 and bounded and described as follows; The West half of the
 South East quarter of Section number Ten (10) in Township
 Number Seventy four (74) West of Range Number Twenty six
 (26) West, containing Eighty acres more or less.

So have and to hold said premises, with the appurtenances, unto
 the said Gacy Dicken her heirs and assigns forever. And the
 said Mazy A. Miller and Clark Miller husband of the aforesaid,
 for themselves, Heirs, Executors and Administrators, hereby covenant
 with said Gacy Dicken her heirs and assigns, that they are
 lawfully seized of the premises aforesaid, and that the said prem-
 ises are free and clear of all Incumbrances whatsoever, and that

we will forever warrant and defend the same with the appurtenances, unto the said Gacy Dicken, heirs and assigns, against all lawful claims and demands, of all persons whomsoever.
