This Indenture made and entered
 into this November the 11th Eleventh
 day, in the year of Our Lord One
 thousand Eight hundred and fifty,

between Doctor H. Whited and Sarah Whited his wife, of the County
 of Madison and State of Iowa, of the first part, and Caleb Hardesty
 and Elizabeth Hardesty his wife, of Madison County and State
 of Iowa, of the second part, Witnesseth; That the said party of the
 first part for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred
 dollars, to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-
 edged, doth hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the
 party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all that
 certain tract or parcel of land Situated, lying and being in the

County and State aforesaid, known and designated as follows, being the East half of the South East quarter of Section Thirty five in Township Seventy six N. of Range Twenty seven W., containing Eighty acres more or less. To have and to hold the said granted and bargained premises together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereof unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever, and the said party of the first part for his heirs executors and administrators doth covenant with the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns that they are lawfully seized of the premises above conveyed, and that they are free from all incumbrance and the above bargained premises in the quiet possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns against the lawful claims and demands of all persons, the said party of the first part and his heirs will forever warrant and defend. — In witness whereof the said party of the first part, hath hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written
