and convey all our right unto George Foglesong of the County and
State aforesaid, the following described premises, together with all the
appurtenances thereunto belonging, The North half of the South West
quarter of Section Fifteen, except lots No One (1) and No Four (4) as
described by the referees of the Estate of Henry Groseclose late of the
County of Madison and State aforesaid, and Thirty three (33) acres
off of the East side of the North East quarter of the South West qr.
of Section Twenty two (22) Township Seventy seven (77) North of
Range No Twenty eight (28) of the fifth Pr. Meridian.
