This Indenture Made this Nineteenth day  
of December in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and sixty three between Francis  
H. Rougar and Elizabeth his wife and Weston A. Ogden and  
Ellen M. his wife of Galesburg Knox County Illinois of the  
first part and Miss D. Cook of Galesburg Knox Co Illinois  
Witnesseth that the said party of the first part for and in  
consideration of the sum of four hundred Dollars in hand paid  
by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these  
presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said party of the  
second part his heirs and assigns all the following described lot  
piece or parcel of land situate in the same in the County of  
Madison and State of Iowa to wit the North East Quarter  
of section number Twenty five in Township Number Seventy  
four North of Range Number Twenty nine West of the fifth  
principal meridian (R. 2 E of sec N 25, T 74 N of S 29 W of 5 P M)  
Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto  
belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversions or revisions  
remainder and remainder rents issues and profits thereof and all the  
estate right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of the  
said party of the first part either in law or equity of or to  
the above bargain premises with the hereditaments and  
appurtenances to have and to hold the said premises above  
bargained and described with the appurtenances unto the said  
party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever

And the said Francis H. Rougar & Elizabeth & his wife & Weston  
A. Ogden & Ellen M. his wife parties of the first part hereby expressly  
wave release and relinquish unto the said party of the second  
part his heirs executors administrators and assigns all right  
title claim interest and benefit whatsoever in and to the  
above described premises and each and every part thereof which  
is given by or results from all laws of this State pertaining to  
the exemption of homesteads and the said Francis H. Rougar  
and Weston A. Ogden party of the first part for his heirs  
executors and administrators do covenant grant bargain and  
agree to and with the said party of the second part his heirs  
and assigns that at the time of the sealing and delivery of  
these presents they are well seised of the premises above con-  
veyed as of a good sure perfect absolute and indefeasible  
estate of inheritance in law in fee simple and have good

right full power and lawful authority to grant bargain  
sell and convey the same in manner and form aforesaid and  
that the same are free and clear from all former and other grants  
bargains sales liens taxes assessments and incumbrances of what  
kind or nature soever and the above bargaining premises in the  
quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part  
his heirs and assigns against all and every person or persons  
lawfully claiming and to claim the whole or any part thereof the  
said party of the first part shall and will Warrant and forever  
Defend against their own acts
