Know all Men by these Presents, That we Rachel B. Wilson and Christopher Wilson
of Madison County and State of Iowa
for Four Hundred & fifty ¹⁰⁰ Dollars, in hand paid, by
John C. Culver
of Madison County, and State of Iowa
do hereby **Sell and Convey**, unto the said
John C. Culver
the following described premises, situate in the County of Madison, and State of Iowa, to-wit:
The East fractional half of the North East Quarter of section
number three (3) Township Number Seveny Seven (77) North
of Range number twenty nine (29) West of the 5th P.M.

And we hereby covenant with the said John C. Culver
that we hold said premises by good
and perfect title, that we have good, right, and lawful authority, to sell and convey the same: that
they are free, and clear of all liens and incumbrances whatsoever. And we covenant to warrant
and defend the said premises against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever; and the said
Christopher Wilson hereby relinquishes his right of dower in and to the above
described premises.
