

The United States of America
To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas
in pursuance of the act of Congress, approved September
28th 1850 entitled "An act granting bounty land to
certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military service of
the United States" Warrant No 46730 for 80 Acres, issued in favor of Anna
Dunlap, widow of William Dunlap, Private in Captain Stokes and Scroggs'
Companies, 1st Regiment, Ohio Militia, war 1812, has been assigned by the
said Anna Dunlap to William E. Carr alias William E. Kerr and
has been returned to the General Land Office, with evidence that the same has
been duly located upon the South half of the North East quarter of Section
Fourteen, in Township Seventy seven, of Range Twenty nine, in the district
of lands subject to sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa, containing Eighty
Acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned
to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye, That
there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said William E. Carr
alias Wm E. Kerr the tract of land above described; To have and to hold the
said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William E.
Carr alias William E. Kerr and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I, Abraham Lincoln President of the United States
of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the
General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the
City of Washington, the tenth day of April in the year of Our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and sixty two, and of the Independence of the
United States the Eighty sixth.
