 unto Andrew J. Hogg, the following described Real Estate  
 to wit: commencing at a point ten rods North of the Sou-  
 th East corner of Section ten, Township No. Seventy  
 four, North of Range Twenty seven West, thence running  
 North ten rods, thence West One hundred and Sixty  
 rods, thence South ten rods, thence East One hundred  
 and Sixty rods to the place of beginning, containing  
 ten acres. And we warrant the title thereto against  
 the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. In  
 testimony whereof we have hereunto set William Fenimore  
 our hands and seals, this 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1864. Martha Fenimore
