Greeting: Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved March 3<sup>d</sup> 1855 entitled, "An act in Addition to certain Acts granting Bounty land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the General Land Office, Warrant N<sup>o</sup> 49078 for 80 Acres, in favor of Elizabeth Covley widow of Edward Covley, Private Captain Cathlans Company Ohio Militia, War 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South half of the North East quarter of Section One in Township Seventy five North, of Range Twenty six West, in the District of lands formerly subject to Sale at Chariton, now Des Moines Iowa, Containing Eighty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Elizabeth Covley to Robert Cleland and James Cleland; in whose favor said tract has been located, Now Know ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Robert Cleland and James Cleland as assignees as aforesaid and to their heirs the tract of land above described. To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Robert Cleland and James Cleland as assignees as aforesaid and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Andrew Johnson President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the fifteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty five, and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty ninth.
