dollars, to us in hand paid by Newton & Stitt of the Town of Winterset  
in the County of Madison and State of Iowa the receipt whereof we do hereby  
acknowledge, have given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and  
confirmed and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and  
confirm unto the said Newton & Stitt and unto their heirs and assigns  
forever, The following described premises and Real Estate, that is to say, Lot  
Number Eleven (No 11) in Hutchings Addition to the Town of Winterset

in the County of Madison and State of Iowa, and being the same premises and Real Estate conveyed to the said Frederick Geiger by Jacob F. Kappes and Anna Kappes his wife, and Frederick Reinig and Helena Reinig his wife by deed dated the first day of March AD 1859, and Recorded in the Recorders Office of Madison County, Iowa, in Record Book No. page 6, to which deed and the record thereof reference is hereby had and made, To have and to hold the said granted premises, with all the appurtenances and privileges to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining, to the said Newton & Stitt and their heirs and assigns forever, to their own proper use, benefit and behoof, as a good and indefeasible estate in fee simple, and we the said Frederick Geiger and Martha A. Geiger for ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant with the said Newton & Stitt their heirs and assigns, that before and until the sealing and delivery of these presents, we were lawfully seized in fee of the above granted premises and appurtenances; that we have good right, full power, and lawful authority to sell and convey the same to them the said Newton and Stitt, that the said premises are free from all incumbrance whatever, and that we do and will warrant and defend the same unto the said Newton and Stitt their heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever.
