 To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.
 Know ye, That in pursuance of an Act of

Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional Military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th 1847, William P. Stewart Private and promoted to Lieutenant in Captain White's Company first Regiment Ohio Volunteers, having deposited in the General Land Office a Warrant in his favor, numbered 68.888 There is therefore granted by the United States unto Ebenezer Elliott Assignee of said William P. Stewart and to his heirs,

The North fractional half of the North West quarter of Section One, and the North fractional half of the North East quarter of Section Two in Township Seventy five - of Range Twenty eight, in the district of lands subject to sale at Fairfield Iowa, containing one hundred and sixty three Acres and Ninety six hundredths of an Acre, according to the Official plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General, which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th 1847. Excess paid for as per Receivers receipt numbered 19.310, To have and to hold the said parts of said Sections of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Ebenezer Elliott and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Millard Fillmore President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
