

## MADISON COUNTY, IA - BOOK W

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Charles L. Kühn & wife  
 To { Deed  
 Cunningham & Newman

This Indenture, made and entered  
 into this 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 1868, by and  
 between Charles L. Kühn and his wife

Elizabeth Kühn of the County of Oldham and State of Kentucky, of  
 the first part, and Peter R. Cunningham and Peter S. Newman  
 of Madison County and State of Iowa of the second part.

Witnesseth; That the said parties of the first part for and in consider-  
 ation of the sum of Four hundred and twenty dollars, to be paid on  
 or before the 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 1874, for which amount of four hundred  
 and twenty dollars, the said Cunningham and Newman have this  
 day executed to me, the said Charles L. Kühn their promissory Note,  
 made due and payable on or before the 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 1874, bearing  
 interest from date, at the rate of ten per cent per annum, and to secure  
 the payment of said Note the said parties of the first part hereby  
 retains a lien upon the land hereby conveyed, have granted, bargained,  
 sold and conveyed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell,  
 confirm and convey unto the said parties of the second part their heirs  
 &c. forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County  
 of Madison, and State of Iowa, and described as follows, to-wit:

The East half of the South West quarter of Section Seven-  
 teen, and the North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section  
 Twenty, in Township Seventy five North of Range Twenty nine, West,  
 in Township of Webster, containing One hundred and twenty Acres.  
 And being the same tract or parcel of land upon which Land Warrant  
 No. 49,832 was located by the said Charles L. Kühn.

To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land  
 unto the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns &c.  
 forever together with all and singular the appurtenances and here-  
 ditaments thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining.

And the said parties of the first part for themselves, their heirs &c.,  
 covenant and agree to and with the said parties of the second part,  
 their heirs &c. to forever warrant and defend the title to the above  
 described tract or parcel of land unto the said second parties their  
 heirs &c. against the claim or claims of all and every person claiming  
 or to claim the same whomever. - In testimony whereof the said Charles  
 L. Kühn and his wife Elizabeth (who joins herein for the purpose of relinquish-  
 ing all her right to power in the land herein conveyed) have hereunto set  
 their hand the day and year first herein written
