This Indenture, made the 30 day  
of June in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred and sixty five.

Between Charles M. Williams of the Township of Plain,  
Suzerne County and State of Pennsylvania, and Elvira A. Williams  
his wife of the first part, and J. M. Courtright of the Boro of Wilkes  
Barre, County and State aforesaid, of the second part; Witnesseth,  
That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum  
of Five hundred dollars lawful money of the United States of America,  
well and truly paid by the said party of the second part, to the said  
party of the first part, at and before the sealing and delivery of these  
presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained,  
sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, conveyed and confirmed, and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, convey and confirm,  
unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, all that  
certain piece or parcel of land situate in Madison County in the  
State of Iowa, being:

The West fractional half and the South East -  
quarter of the North West quarter of Section Seven in Township  
Seventy six North of Range Twenty nine West, in the district of lands  
subject to sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa, containing One hundred  
and Six Acres and eighty - hundredths of an acre be the same more  
or less, being the same land patented to the said Charles M. Williams  
by patent bearing date the fifteenth day of May A.D. one thousand eight  
hundred and fifty five -

Together with all and singular, the buildings,  
improvements, woods, ways, rights, liberties, privileges, hereditaments and  
appurtenances, to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the  
reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and  
profits thereof, and of every part and parcel thereof; and also, all the estate,  
right, title, interest, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever,  
both in law and equity, of the said party of the first part, of, in, and  
to the said premises, with the appurtenances; To have and to hold the  
said premises, with all and singular the appurtenances, unto the said party  
of the second part, his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use, benefit and  
behalf of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.

And the said C. M. Williams his heirs, executors and administrators, do  
by these presents covenant, grant and agree to and with the said party  
of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that he the C. M. Williams his  
heirs, all and singular the hereditaments and premises herein above  
described and granted, or mentioned and intended to be so, with the

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appurtenances, unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against him the said C. M. Williams his heirs, and against all and every other person or persons, whomsoever lawfully claiming & or to claim the same or any part thereof, shall and will **Warrant** and forever **defend** —

Williams and Elvira A. his wife who, I am satisfied are the grantors mentioned in the above deed or conveyance, and I having first made known to them the contents thereof, have acknowledged that they signed, sealed and delivered the same as their voluntary act and deed; and the said Elvira A. Williams being of full age, on a private examination apart from her said husband before me acknowledged that she signed, sealed and delivered the same as her voluntary act and deed, freely, without any fear, threats or compulsion of her said husband and also acknowledged that she executed the same and relinquished her dower in the lands therein described freely and without compulsion from or influence of her said husband, all of which is hereby certified
