 the following described land, situate and lying in Madison County,
 and State of Iowa to wit:

Sots No One & Two (1+2) in Block No Twenty eight (28) in
 the original plat of Winteret, Iowa, — being the undivided $\frac{2}{9}$ of the
 above described lots — In Testimony Whereof, we have this day set our

 AD 1868, — And the said Eleyt H Wood & Emma Wood hereby
 relinquishes their right of dower in and to the above described premises.
