Stout of the County Guernsey, and State of Ohio, do hereby remise, release, and forever quit claim, unto the said Germin D. Stout, his heirs and assigns forever, all our title, interest and estate both legal and equitable in the following premises, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, being two tracts of land, formerly belonging to William Marshall, deceased, situate, lying and being in the County of Madison, and State of Iowa, and bounded and described as follows;

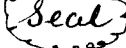
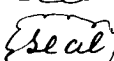
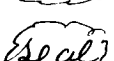
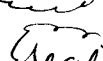
