 wife of the said Cyrus Ford, Robert Marshal
 and Sarah Marshal wife of said Robert Marshal, and Elijah Forsythe
 and Margaret Forsythe wife of the said Elijah Forsythe, for and in
 consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars, to us in hand
 paid by Germin D. Stout of the County Guernsey, and State of Ohio,
 do hereby remise, release, and forever quit claim, unto the said Germin
 D. Stout, his heirs and assigns forever, all our title, interest and estate
 both legal and equitable in the following premises, with the appurtenances
 thereto belonging, being two tracts of land, formerly belonging to
 William Marshall, deceased, situate, lying and being in the County of
 Madison and State of Iowa, and bounded and described as follows;

The West half of the North West quarter of Section Twenty three (23)
 of Township Seventy six (76) of Range Twenty nine (29) containing Eighty (80) acres
 more or less. — Also the West half of the North West quarter of Section
 Twenty seven (27) of Township Seventy six (76) of Range Twenty nine (29)
 containing eighty (80) acres more or less. — In testimony whereof we have







 separate and apart from their said husbands, and the contents of said instrument
 made known to them by me, they then declared that they did voluntarily sign
 seal and acknowledge the same and that they are still satisfied therewith;
 this 22nd day of May A.D. 1861
