To all to whom these presents shall come greeting

Whereas, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No 14,131 for 100 Acres, issued in favor of James McVey, Private in Captain Gray's Company, Kentucky Militia, Three Services, War 1812, has been returned to the General Land Office, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon,

The East half of the North West quarter, and the East half of the South West quarter, of Section Thirty one, in Township Seventy six North, of Range Twenty eight West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa, containing One hundred and Sixty Acres, according to the Official plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General, which has been assigned to James W. Vanlaningham,

Now, Know ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said James W. Vanlaningham the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said James W. Vanlaningham and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Pierce President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the Twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, and of the Independence of the United States the Seventy ninth.
