hundred and fifty dollars the receipt
whereof is duly acknowledged, we E. P. Douglass and
Clementina Douglass his wife, of the aforesaid State and
County, by our Attorney in fact J. R. P. Douglass do hereby
convey to M. D. Canfield of the County of Madison and
State of Iowa, the following tract of land lying and situate
in the County of Madison and State of Iowa, to wit;

The North half $\frac{1}{2}$ of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$)
of Section Fifteen (15), Township Seventy four (74) North of
Range Twenty six (26), containing Eighty (80) acres more
or less, according to the U. S. Survey.

We covenant with the said M. D. Canfield that we are
lawfully seized and possessed of the aforesigned tract
of land, that we have a right to convey, and that we will
warrant the title of the same against all persons whosoever.
