To all to whom these presents shall come,
Greeting;

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," there has been deposited in the General Land Office, Warrant N^o 7325, for 120 Acres, in favor of Eliza Bennett widow of John Bennett, deceased, a Private in Captain Cook's Company of Pennsylvania Militia, War of 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon:

The East half of the North East quarter, and the North East quarter of the South East quarter of Section Twenty three, in Township Seventy four, North, of Range Twenty eight West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Chariton, Iowa, containing One hundred and twenty Acres, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Eliza Bennett to David Fisher, in whose favor said tracts have been located,

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said David Fisher, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tracts of Land above described; To have and to hold the ^{said} tracts of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said David Fisher as Assignee as aforesaid, and to his heirs and assigns forever;

In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Pierce President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. — Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the fifteenth day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty six, and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty first.
